

## GLACIOLOGICAL SYMPOSIUM OF 2010

### First Circular and Call for Papers

International Glaciological Symposium will be held in the Kazan' city of Russia from May 31 through June 3, 2010. The main topic of the Symposium is «**Ice and Snow in the Climatic System**». The Glaciological Association, Institute of Geography of the Russian Academy of Sciences, and Kazan' State University are organizing the meeting.

#### Scientific Program

The Symposium will cover a wide range of glaciological problems based on results obtained from recent investigations of processes between the cryosphere and all types of natural ices with the atmosphere. Each oral presentation will be allowed 20 minutes, including discussion. The program includes blocks of time for poster presentations and discussion.

Abstracts, up to 250 words in length, exclusive of title and authorship, should be sent to the Symposium site < [glas-conf.igras.ru](http://glas-conf.igras.ru) > **before February 1, 2010.**

Requirements on the abstracts are as follows: 1) Russian or English language; 2) Title must not exceed 10 words; 3) A one-line text should not contain more than 2000 characters without spaces, i.e. to cover one page in the A4 format; 4) Title, authors and institute are typed in separate lines; 5) Microsoft Word (in formats \*.doc or \*.rtf) and Times New Roman font should be used; 8) No underlining, bold font or italics should be used.

Reports presented at the Symposium will be published as individual papers in the new peer-reviewed journal «**Ice and Snow**» which is published as 4 issues each year. Texts of the reports should be sent for publication **before April 1, 2010** via electronic mail to O.V. Rototaeva at [khronika@mail.ru](mailto:khronika@mail.ru) at the Glaciological Association. Acceptable manuscripts should be between 8 to 15 pages in length (Times New Roman font, 12 pt, 1.5 line spacing) including photos, figures and tables (minimum 300 dpi resolution as tif or gif electronic files).

All oral presentations are to be done using PC-based Power Point or similar formats; alternative needs for presentations should be sent to the Organizing Committee in advance. The Symposium Program will be delivered to participants at registration.

According to the Program participants should plan to arrive on Sunday, May 30; starting May 31, the program will consist of 4 days of scientific sessions, including excursions around the University, the city, and the Volga River. One evening, a reception will be organized, and its cost will be announced later.

#### Registration

Participants can preregister for the meeting on the Symposium website ([glas-conf.igras.ru](http://glas-conf.igras.ru)). All necessary information about hotels, transportation, and payments will be found there. **The site will open on December 15, 2009.**

Individual registration fees for participation will be 1500 roubles. This fee includes coffee breaks during the sessions as well as a conference bag containing the program, a book of abstracts and other information, including a subscription to the journal «Ice and Snow», in which the symposium materials will be published.

All potential participants (including non-presentors) are invited to register on-line **before April 1, 2010.** The following information is necessary:

1) personal information (name, surname, position and organization, contact information,

e-mail address ). We ask that you indicate in the field «Comments» the rough title of your report (if presenting) and information about the format (oral or poster, and i.e., pc or mac);

2) lodging: please, provide dates of arrival and departure and first choice of preferred hotels. Due to the limited number of rooms available, preference will be given to those who register early;

3) abstract (if you are presenting a poster or oral paper);

4) your anticipated participation in excursions.
